



Remote Area First Aid Level II Off Shore (HLTAFA2A) (Group Booking Only)

The Remote Area First Aid Level II course aims to provide a solid practical and theoretical base from which to apply appropriate first aid procedures, including emergency life support and accident management when medical aid is not readily available and needs to be maintained for an extended period.

The course is designed for:

- Accident Prevention
- Steps in Incident Management
- Mechanisms of Injury
- Casualty Assessment - The Primary and Secondary Survey
- Casualty Management and Monitoring
- The Factors of Survival
- Summoning Assistance
- Action Plans and Evacuation Issues

Course can be tailored to suit unique user needs or environmental conditions.

Remote Area Emergency Care (Standard Course)

The 24 hour program is designed for participants in outdoor activities who wish to extend and enhance their first aid skills. The course extends the competencies normally attained through a Level 2 Basic First Aid Certificate emphasizing the management of remote area situations, along with the knowledge and skills in the use of a limited range of specialized equipment. The course looks at problem solving, working in co-operation with others along with the identification and causes of illnesses and accidents in remote settings. Through out the course participants will be required to experience realistic and appropriate scenarios necessary to develop the skills required.

Pre-requisite: Nil

Certification

Participants who successfully complete the courses will be awarded Swinburne University of Technology approved certification. It is recommended that CPR refresher training be undertaken annually on completion of this course.

Course Venue

The course is presented at venue to suit the training needs of the participants. Participants are given the opportunity to develop their incident management and casualty assessment skills by participating in realistic and appropriate activities.
